From the Pastor

I believe God wants His followers to be extraordinary. He wants us to stand out...be a light in the darkness. This is my vision for GT Church. Recently, I was reading John MacArthur's book: Twelve Ordinary Men. He points out how, in Matthew Chapters 8, 9, and 10, Jesus shares leadership responsibilities with his disciples. Our Lord chose ordinary men and trained them to become extraordinary leaders. There are four natural progressions in their training. First, they simply followed Jesus. These followers grew as they listened to and learned from His teachings. A fundamental principle of discipleship training is that you cannot be trained as a leader if you are not interested in learning and following. In other words, it is difficult to lead others if you have not first learned to follow. How can you lead if you do not understand being led? Second, there must be commitment. When Jesus called these men, they left everything to follow him. You cannot be extraordinary if you fail to commit. If there is absence of self-sacrifice, there is absence of service. There is a connection between dying to self and service to God and for God. We are living in the most self centered society since the days of Noah. Jesus showed His followers the virtue of true servant leadership. Commitment to something greater than self gain is the key to becoming a servant leader like our Wonderful Lord. Third, there is internship. The Twelve had experiential opportunities and were privileged to spend premium time with Jesus, being mentored and taught by Him. Think of it. How would you like to be mentored personally by the Son of God? Such education and experience can not be obtained in Seminary. It is through the process of internship that their character was shaped and their destiny fashioned. The final step of extraordinary leadership is empowerment for specific service. This is primarily the work of the Holy Spirit. Jesus instructed His followers to stay in Jerusalem until they received the dynamic power from the Holy Spirit so that they might fulfill the Great Commission (Acts 1:8). These were ordinary men. It was the power of the Holy Spirit that made them extraordinary. The lesson here is God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things so that He can be glorified. John MacArthur says, "God's favorite instruments are nobodies, so that no man can boast before God."



GT Church supports Missionaries Paul and Becky Hancock. Metro Detroit these days has the fourth largest resettlement of Middle Eastern refugees in the U.S. In fact, the east side of nearby Dearborn is 97 percent Arab Muslim. Missionaries Paul P. "Trey" and Becky Hancock, Assemblies of God U.S. missionaries serving with Intercultural Ministries, know these numbers well. They've answered God's call to bring the love of Jesus to this unique population. Hancock, 64, and his wife, Becky, live in Dearborn, where they connect with Arab Muslims.

Hancock says God planted the seeds of his call during his teenage years in Birmingham, Alabama. During the early 1970s, Hancock says the revival that swept high schools in that city spurred him to reach across cultural barriers.

While in Dearborn for cultural training in 1987, he says God called him to reach Arab Muslims. In 2000, Hancock started Springwells Church in Dearborn. The church keeps a constant stream of ministry activities going to reach Arab Muslims: drama, Royal Rangers, kids programs, and park outreach events.

The church sits less than 10 minutes away from the Islamic Center of America, in the heart of a neighborhood that's 97 percent Muslim." Jesus said, "I want you here." So we're here," Hancock said. "And what better place in the whole wide world to find people that don't know Jesus, that need him and need what Jesus has to offer."

"Right here; we're not making it hard for them to come to the Lord," he continued.

The church began meeting in the Hancocks' home in 2000, more than a decade after the pastor and his family first arrived in Dearborn to minister to Muslims. Hancock says he heard the call of God while in Dearborn receiving cultural training. "And just walking and just praying, got down to about right here, right here at this very spot, and the Lord spoke to me and said, "If you're going to learn about these people, you've got to live with them," he explained to CBN News while standing in a neighborhood on the city's south side. "And I thought, "Whoa! That didn't come from me. I knew who that was; it was really clear; it was really distinct, and it was a prompting from the Holy Spirit. And I said, "Okay, Lord."

It took Hancock five years before he saw his first converts in Dearborn - five Arab-Muslims who accepted Christ at a Bible club held in his home. However, Hancock is convinced that many Muslims in Dearborn already believe in Christ, yet are afraid to say so because of the high cost of conversion.

Hancock is overjoyed when Muslims accept Jesus. "It lights my fire, man," he said. "When they say yes to Jesus, it's an amazing thing. It's an amazing thing, especially after they get baptized because that's when they're saying to the world, "I belong to Jesus." In ministering in this area, spiritual warfare is definitely involved. For example, Hancock says in the last decade, more than a dozen churches in the Dearborn area have been sold to Muslims and turned into mosques.

On one former church now known as the American Muslim Center, the cross has been removed from the steeple. On another, an Islamic House of Wisdom sign has actually been placed over the cross on the steeple.

Still, Hancock knows the Muslims who purchase the churches are not the enemy. "I'm not fighting them cause I want them to come to Jesus," he explained. The pastor looks forward to the day he learns many Muslims have responded to the Gospel message through his ministry. "I hope when I stand in front of the Lord that there are thousands standing behind me that I had no idea that were listening," Hancock shared.









A Ministry for Children and Youth

The vision of GT Church is to be a lighthouse in this community and to send beams of light out around the world for the cause of Christ. We recently advanced this vision by investing in Christian Outreach Center. GT Church had the honor of donating a 25 passenger People Mover Van to the Pinellas Christian Outreach Center. This van will be used to pick up underprivileged children in our community for ministry. Christian Outreach Center has been ministering to children in Pinellas County for over 20 years. Their mission is simple: to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to needy children and their families by ministering both to physical and spiritual needs. This van will be used weekly to fulfill this mission for the Glory of God.




Missions Convention Sunday, February 20

Reverend Terrell (Terry) Raburn currently serves as the Superintendent of the Peninsular Florida District Council of the Assemblies of God and facilitates the management of the district with its various ministries and leadership responsibilities that incorporate assisting approximately 1,400 credentialed ministers and 350 churches. As Superintendent, Terry also oversees the District Office staff and the daily workload of the various departments, assists district ministers with problems and is always on call for emergencies across the peninsula. Terry and Athena travel to churches weekly to minister, dedicate facilities, and serve the people of our district in any capacity needed.



He represents the Fellowship nationally and overseas while serving as Chairman of Southeastern University, a member of the General Presbytery of the Assemblies of God, and is a board member for Real Life Children's Ranch, Native American University and American Bible Society for life. Among the Superintendent's many assignments, he also sits on the Board of Directors for the Church Extension Plan Group and speaks at conferences and councils in the U.S. and internationally.





Terry and Athena are both ordained ministers in the Assemblies of God, and Athena holds a degree in Business Administration. Together the Raburns authored the story of their missionary journey in the Middle East, *Under the Guns in Beirut*, and a discipleship book for teens, *Starting Blocks*, and numerous articles for publications and periodicals. In 1990, Terry began serving as the National Director of the Divisions of Church Ministries in the General Council Headquarters in Springfield, Missouri. Responsibilities included Youth, Chi-Alpha, Speed the Light, Women's Ministries, Missionettes, Men's Ministries, Royal Rangers, and Light for the Lost, Music Department, Sunday School, BGMC and Christian Education. During his tenure, Raburn facilitated the development of programs and church educational materials and represented the Fellowship in travel and on many boards. In 1996 Terry Raburn became the Superintendent and Home Missions Director of Peninsular Florida.

Reverend Terry Raburn is a fourth generation preacher whose grandfathers on both sides of his family were pioneers in Pentecost, as well as Charter Members of the Assemblies of God in the Florida and Georgia districts. Terry's mother and father were church planters and pastors in the southeast.

Over the past 45 years, Bob and Beverly Roberts have served as Youth Pastors, Senior Pastors, and Foreign Missionaries with the Assemblies of God. The message of their hearts is rooted in the Word of God communicating God's heartbeat for those who have yet to hear the message of the Gospel.

The Roberts' missions experience consisted of 14 years as missionaries to the Philippines. While serving in the Philippines, Bob oversaw numerous ministries that included the director of Asia's Little Ones, an Assemblies of God holistic ministry for the children of Asia Pacific and director of ICI, International Correspondence Institute.



In 2020, Bob stepped down as Senior Pastor of New Life Christian Fellowship in Grand Blanc, Michigan where he served for 20 years. He presently remains on staff at New Life as an associate pastor overseeing missions and other ministries. He also teaches *Introduction To World Missions* at Northpoint College in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

One of his greatest joys has been to serve on the Michigan District Missionary Board that approves all future missionaries for the Assemblies of God from Michigan.

Bob studied at Trinity Bible College in Ellendale, North Dakota, Southeastern University in Lakeland, Florida, and APTS, Asia Pacific Theological Seminary in the Philippines.










Adult Bible Study
